2001 Census Key Statistics for Hammersmith & Fulham

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Introduction

Following the release of summary age and gender data from the Census last September, the Office For National Statistics (ONS) have now published a series of tables of Key Statistics at Local Authority level providing more than 500 counts or percentages. The data for Hammersmith & Fulham is reproduced in full below, along with some comparisons with other areas and with 1991 data where possible. Comparisons are not always possible because of definitional changes or absence of equivalent tables at the two dates.

In the case of comparisons with 1991 data, more reliability should be placed on percentage breakdowns of the population rather than to absolute numbers. This is because there are some differences in the population base between the two Census dates:

- in 2001 the population data has been corrected for under-enumeration whereas the data sets published for 1991 were unadjusted for this. This makes a difference of between 1 and 2 per cent.
- there were Borough boundary changes in 1994 and 1996 involving a net loss to the Borough of approximately 1,000 people.
- the definition of the population base differs in some respects. In 2001 students are counted at term-time address whereas in 1991 they were counted at their home address. However, this change is not expected to have a great effect on data for Hammersmith & Fulham.

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Summary of Key Points

- Census data indicates that there was a higher rate of increase in the population of Hammersmith & Fulham than Inner or Greater London between 1991 and 2001 (Table 1). The actual increase is more accurately derived from the Mid-Year Estimates than the Censuses for comparability reasons, and this is 7.6% from the revised set of Mid Year Estimates issued by ONS in February 2003.
- The age structure shows a higher proportion of young adults aged 20-29 (23.8%) compared to Inner London (20.9%) or Greater London (17.1%). The proportion of children aged 0-17 (18.3%) is lower than in the wider region but has increased since 1991. The proportion of those aged 65 or over is 10.5%, lower than in 1991 but about the same as Inner London as a whole. (Table 2)
- 3. The Borough has the second highest proportion (54.7%) of any local authority in England & Wales of **single people** in the adult population. Four in ten (40.3%) of all households consist of just one person. On the other hand, the Borough has the third lowest proportion (26.0%) of adults who are married or re-married. Some 13.1% of adults are living as cohabiting couples. (Tables 3, 4 and 5)
- 4. The proportion of **single parent** households with dependent children has stayed fairly constant (6.5% of the total compared to 6.3% in 1991). Some 91% of them are headed by women, of whom only 16.0% are in full-time employment. Inner and Greater London have higher proportions of single parent households. (Table 8)
- 5. There is a great diversity of different types of household within Hammersmith & Fulham. The Borough has the fourth highest proportion (22.3%) of any local authority in England & Wales of '**other**' households, *other than* single persons or families living on their own. Most of these consist of two or more unrelated adults living together.
- 6. Average **household size** is 2.16 people, which is the twelfth lowest of any local authority in England & Wales, though it has risen slightly since 1991. (Table 31)
- 7. The population is healthier than the wider region, partly as a result of age structure. The proportion of people with **limiting long-term illness** has increased since 1991 and now affects 14.7% of the total, but this is a lower proportion than Inner or Greater London. Those adults who are permanently sick or disabled has gone up to 4.7%. The overall proportion of people whose **health** was 'not good' is 8.2%, a lower proportion than the wider area. (Tables 6, 7 and 13)
- One in five households (20.1%) had a different address one year before Census date, a mobility rate which is the seventh highest rate of any local authority in England & Wales. Of those who had moved, 3.4% had arrived from outside the UK. (Table 9)
- 9. The proportion of residents of **ethnic groups** other than white has gone up from 17.5% in 1991 to 22.1%. The largest grouping is people of Black ethnic origin (11.1%) and the proportion of people of Black or Black British Caribbean origin is the eleventh highest of any local authority in England & Wales. The ethnic minority population is lower than Inner London as a whole (34.3%) or Greater London (28.9%). However, the proportion of Irish as an ethnic group (4.8%) is the third highest of any local authority in England & Wales. (Table 11)
- 10. A third (33.6%) of all residents were **born outside the UK**, a rise from 28.4% in 1991 (Table 10). The Borough has the 15th highest proportion of any local authority in England & Wales of people born outside the European Union.
- 11. Hammersmith & Fulham has a diversity of **religious groupings** among residents. One in ten belong to non-Christian religions and the next largest religious group after Christians is Muslims (6.9%). Some 17.6% of residents have no religion. The question was a voluntary one and there was a 9% non-response. (Table 12)

- 12. The **unemployment rate** almost halved since 1991 to 5.0% at April 2001. Nearly three in ten (28.7%) of the unemployed are long-term unemployed. These rates are are lower than Inner London as a whole though relatively high compared to national rates. (Tables 13,14 and 15)
- 13. Activity rates for women aged 16-74 have dropped a little, from 68.2% in 1991 to 64.0% in 2001. Similarly, that for men has dropped from 79.6% to 75.3%. (Tables 13,14 and 15)
- 14. The proportion of the **self-employed** has risen to 10.3% of those aged 16-74. Fulltime students who are economically active have also gone up significantly. (Tables 13,14 and 15)
- 15. Proportions of working age residents in higher-paid jobs are increasing. Four in ten adults (40.8%) are managers, senior officials or professionals compared to 35.9% in Inner London and 32.4% in Greater London. 17.9% are in higher managerial or professional positions: this has increased significantly from 1991 when only 12.3% fell within this occupation group. There have been similar significant rises in associate professional and technical occupations: 15.8% in 1991 to 23.5% in 2001. On the other hand, 11.3% are in 'routine' or 'semi-routine' operations and 5.5% have never worked or are long-term unemployed. (Tables 20, 24)
- 16. People **working from home** have increased from 5.7% of employed people in 1991 to 8.9% in 2001.
- 17. Travel to work by residents by train has increased from 1.7% in 1991 to 3.7% in 2001 and travel to work by tube has risen slightly (to 37.6%, which is the highest figure of any local authority in England & Wales). However, travel by bus has fallen from 12.8% in 1991 to 10.7% in 2001. Altogether, travel to work by public transport (52.0%) is the seventh highest figure of any local authority in England & Wales. Driving to work by car has fallen from 22.4% in 1991 to 18.0% in 2001 which is the 8th lowest figure in England & Wales. Cycle travel has gone up from 3.8% to 4.8%, which is above the Inner London (3.5%) and Greater London (2.3%) averages. (Table 27)
- 18. Significantly fewer resident adults have no qualifications (17.9%) then in Inner London (22.7%) or Greater London (23.7%); and a higher proportion have higher level qualifications at least of NVQ levels 4-5, HNC or HND (45.1% which is more than double the national rate and is seventh highest of any local authority in England & Wales). (Table 23)
- 19. The number of **household spaces** in the Borough has gone up from 75,464 in 1991 to 77,742 in 2001. Of the total, 2.5% were vacant and 0.5% were second residences. The vacancy rate is lower than Inner London (3.0%) and Greater London (2.6%) (Table 28)
- 20. **Car ownership** has gone up from 48.0% in 1991 to 51.4% in 2001. Car ownership is higher than Inner London generally (49.4%). The proportion of households with more than one car (11.1%) however is very similar to the 1991 figure. (Table 29)
- 21. Data on **tenure** by household shows that owner occupation has continued to rise and 44.0% of households now own their homes compared to 41.9% in 1991. Council tenure has dropped to 19.2% and private renting to 19.7% of all households. Housing Association/RSL renting has risen from 11.1% to 13.5%. (Table 30)
- 22. **Housing conditions** have improved and 88.5% of household spaces now have central heating and sole use of bath/ shower and toilet compared to 72.9% in 1991 (though conditions are marginally better for Inner London as a whole). Average rooms per households have risen from 4.0 in 1991 to 4.2. (Table 31)
- 23. Four in ten (42.2%) of households live above the ground floor. (Table 31)
