

# £1million youth fund supports local groups

## H&F Council has already provided more than £700,000 in funding to help 26 local organisations support young people

It forms part of our new £1million King Charles III Coronation Youth Fund to help give young people the brightest possible future and best opportunity to fulfil their potential.

The Fund is entirely financed by a levy on property developers after H&F took a tough line to ensure the

community benefits from building projects. The rest of the funding will be awarded to local groups next year.

The Coronation Youth Fund reflects King Charles's lifelong dedication through the Prince's Trust to improving the lives of young people.



#### The fund winners include... **Wormwood Scrubs Charitable** Trust and Thames Valley Harriers



The money will provide new floodlights for the Linford Christie Stadium in White City, as well as the re-surfacing of its 400-metre athletics track and the covered 100-metre indoor straight track.

This will benefit both the premier elite athletics club and the entire local community who can use the facilities.

Andrea Broughton, chair of Thames Valley Harriers, said: "We organise training and coaching sessions for children and young people on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays each week, and this refurbishment will ensure that young people in the borough continue to benefit from the athletics coaching that our club can offer them."

Here's what some of the other local groups had to say after receiving the funding:

#### The Brunswick Club for **Young People**

Awarded £45,026

"The grant means we can carry on providing stimulating, engaging activities and opportunities for more than 650 young people a year. We're seen as a lifeline by many families in Fulham." Piers Player, a senior youth worker at The Brunswick Club in Fulham.

#### The Sulgrave Club

Awarded £35,896

# H&F crackdown on anti-social behaviour cuts complaints by 22%

Our Law Enforcement Team is working with the Met Police to win the war on local crime



To support the local Met Police, we have added a 72-strong H&F Law Enforcement Team (LET). They patrol our streets, collect vital intelligence, initiate actions when crime hotspots emerge, and crack down on crime.

Before the launch of our pioneering LET, the Met Police received 8,480 reports of anti-social behaviour in 2021. This included issues such as fly-tipping, noisy neighbours and barking dogs.

The LET have helped cut the number of complaints to the Met to fewer than 6.600 between November 2022 and November 2023. That's a dramatic fall of more than 20 per cent.

"We have taken the view that keeping people safe is always our first priority," said H&F Leader Cllr Stephen Cowan. "In recent years we have invested the largest ever amount into

We have taken the view that keeping people safe is always our first priority 99 fighting crime and its causes, and are spending more each year."

While Met Police Superintendent for H&F, Craig Knight, backed the LET's work by saying: "They are a valuable contribution to the local authority, to the local community - as a visible presence in that community. They bring valuable intelligence and local accountability."

#### How to report anti-social behaviour (ASB)

Residents can report ASB to the council, the police, and housing associations. Or approach our friendly LET officers if you see them out and about. They're here to help, and patrol our streets day and night.

#### Live, work, play and relax in Hammersmith's new Civic Campus – Britain's most exciting arts cultural and business quarter, opening in 2024

Our new Civic Campus will lead Hammersmith's transformation into a global tech and media hotspot.

Its award-winning design from architects RSHP stems from its ethos that sees beauty, accessibility and ecology woven into every aspect of the inclusive scheme.

### **Bringing jobs and** investment into H&F

Since we launched our Industrial Strategy in 2017 over 8,000 jobs have been created locally in science, technology, creative and similar sectors

Our partnership with institutions like Imperial College, London, with its stunning White City campus, has helped bring in over £6bn in investment. We have welcomed established global businesses such as Novartis, L'Oréal and Publicis which now sit alongside a thriving startup community as H&F becomes a world-renowned hub of innovation.

We have helped reduce from 5% to 1.7% the proportion of residents with no qualifications as we work with schools and colleges to prepare people for the jobs of the future.

With 40% of jobs in fast-growing sectors like Life Sciences not requiring a degree, we are working to widen access via apprenticeships to address their recruitment challenges.

These measures contribute to making the borough stronger as we continue to share the prosperity in H&F.

If you normally get an on-street rubbish collection, simply leave your tree where you'd leave your rubbish.

#### Please make sure your real tree:

- is clearly visible
- is not obstructing the pavement
- has had all decorations and pots removed.

Please put your tree out for collection before 7am on your regular collection day – from Tuesday 2 January and Monday 22 January. Or take it to one of the drop-off points below.

#### Here's everything you need to know about the rollout across H&F



#### Why is H&F rolling out new bins?

We're making these changes to increase recycling, keep our streets cleaner and our crews safer. If selected, every home will have an opportunity to ensure the new bins suit their requirements.

The new bin rollout follows a successful launch of wheeled bins to more than 5.000 local households in 2020. Since then, residents have helped us compost over 1,000 tonnes of food waste - the same weight as 86 double-decker London buses.

It means that households receiving wheeled bins no longer need to use clear sacks for recycling. All clean and dry recycling can be placed loose in your recycling bin.

#### What will happen during rollout?

Over the next few months, we'll continue to reach all suitable properties in the borough.

We're speaking to as many residents as we can across H&F about these changes. We want to ensure that the service works for you and vour home. We're also holding local drop-in events in the neighbourhoods getting the new bins. Look out for a letter from us.

#### Will my collection days change?

#### There will be no change to your normal collection days.

The new food waste collections will take place on the same day as your bin collections.

If you receive twice-weekly collections of recycling and waste, your food waste will only be collected on the day of your first collection (for example, if your collection days are Monday and Wednesday, your food waste will only be collected on Monday).

Everything you need to know about recycling during the holidays – including the most popular Christmas items such as small electrical devices and clothing

#### Cards and gift wrap

Recycle Christmas cards and wrapping paper (but not metallic paper or glitter) in your wheeled bin, clear sack or smart bank.



#### **Bulky waste**

For large items, like furniture or appliances, call **020 8733 1100** to book a bulky waste collection. Charges apply.



#### Small electricals

Recycle small electrical items, such as mobile phones and hair dryers, at libraries or by organising a free collection from Traid.

# What happens to your recycling?

We explain how your recycling is collected, sorted and processed

All the paper, cardboard, glass, tins and plastics that you put in your recycling each week is sent to our facility in Wandsworth.

It takes around six minutes for your recycling to be processed and sorted once it's been emptied from the recycling vehicle.

Items are sorted to remove any items that aren't recyclable or that would injure staff or damage machinery.

Once the recycling has been sorted, it's baled up using a very powerful compacter and sent around the country to be recycled into new products.

A recycled fizzy drink tin can be returned to the supermarket shelf in just six weeks!

Recycled aluminium saves more than 90% of the energy needed to manufacture a can from scratch

Glass is 100% recyclable and can be endlessly reprocessed with no loss of quality



# And where does all the food waste go?

It's amazing how your simple food scraps can help create clean energy and crop-boosting fertilisers

Currently, food waste is collected by our crews, who then deliver it to a facility where micro-organisms break down the organic materials without the need for oxygen. This process is called 'anaerobic digestion'.



After 72 hours, biogas is produced and is pumped into the power grid to provide renewable, clean energy to thousands of homes and businesses across the country.

Now that all the potential energy has been extracted from the waste, the leftover material is perfect for high-quality fertiliser.

We give this fertiliser to farmers, helping them to grow food for your next Christmas and New Year celebrations.

## How to recycle small electrical items

#### You can help us save money by recycling your electrical appliances!

Electrical appliances are mostly made of plastic and metal, with small amounts of many other substances, some of which may harm the environment. Reusing and recycling is the best way to reduce the environmental impact of these products.



Bring your small electrical items to be recycled at one of the 17 recycling sites across the borough. These are known as WEEE banks. Some retailers will also accept your small electrical appliances for recycling when you buy new ones. Visit the Recycle Now website (recvclenow.com) to find stores which offer a take-back service.

#### Get your gadgets fixed

If your electrical appliance needs a fix, bring it to the Livat shopping centre in Hammersmith. The West Central London Fixers run regular repair cafes to get your electrical item working its best again. To book in a repair, visit: lbhf.gov.uk/e-repairs



# Why buy when you can borrow?

Local residents have saved more than £80,000 by borrowing from the Library of Things in Hammersmith

In June 2022 we helped launch the borrow-don't-buy hub for useful household gadgets and DIY tools in the Livat Hammersmith shopping centre, King Street.

So far, it has helped save more than 15 tonnes of waste from being thrown away – representing 30 tonnes of carbon emissions.

With more than 100 visitors and 200 items loaned out from as little as £1 every month, borrowing is more and more popular. Our Hammersmith site is now the best used hub of its kind anywhere in the country. It's a great asset for residents as we work to reduce carbon emissions from the things we buy, use, then throw away.

The King Street shopping centre also regularly hosts a variety of events to encourage the repair and reuse of household items, such as electrical items and clothes.

Our new Family Hubs will offer a range of services to help support local families. All children and young people will be catered for, from prenatal to adulthood, as well as their entire families.

This includes activities for children aged 0 to five, as well as youth clubs. Plus, we can help with drug and alcohol support, mental health, and support with financial stress.

Each hub will be the place for families to get help from H&F's family

support team, who will have access to their case history. Our first hub will open in February, at the Stephen Wiltshire Centre in Fulham, and will be for families with children who have special educational needs and disabilities. The other hubs will be in Old Oak W12 and Fulham Court SW6.

# H&F serves up more than a million free breakfasts to pupils



## With families in H&F facing the biggest jump in food prices in more than 45 years, our fight to end food poverty has never been more important

We have now provided more than a million free breakfasts to local primary school pupils as part of our pioneering universal free breakfast offer

Launched in 2019, the free breakfast scheme is just one part of the work we're doing to ensure that no child goes hungry in H&F.

Almost 6,000 pupils are currently eligible for free school meals in H&F – nearly 29% of all local pupils. This is far above the national average of 23.8%.

No child should ever go hungry which is why we will be providing food support to local pupils in need during the Christmas school holiday this year.

With local partners, we will also offer free holiday activities with free food for children and young people in H&F during the upcoming Christmas break.

#### More food poverty support

Here is what else we are doing to support local residents:

#### **Nourish Hub**

We opened the Nourish Hub, a new community food hub on the Edward Woods estate in Shepherds Bush which celebrated its first anniversary this year. Serving 200 meals a day, the centre has now delivered more than 64,000 hot meals in H&F.

#### H&F Foodbank

We support H&F Foodbank, which has four sites across H&F in Fulham, Shepherds Bush, White City and Old Oak.

#### H&F's pioneering dementia-friendly community work has been officially recognised by the Alzheimer's Society charity. Here's why:

Our work has focused on improving diagnosis rates, increasing awareness and better signposting of the support available in H&F.

This has included publishing a 'Living with Dementia' guide, launching the Good Life with Dementia training programme – led by people with dementia for those recently diagnosed - and our weekly Tuesday Club memory cafes for relaxed socialising.

This award would not have been possible without the tireless work of the H&F Dementia Action Alliance which helped us work with local residents and organisations to improve the lives of people with dementia, their families and carers.

Other local organisations which have created welcoming spaces for residents with memory issues include the Hurlingham Club, Nourish Hub, For Brian, and Elgin Resource Centre.

Raymond, a Fulham resident living with dementia, said: "We really appreciate everything that is being done to support us all."

# How free care is helping residents back on their feet



H&F is the only council in the country to offer free care at home to all residents

#### Free home care

Since abolishing all charges in 2014, Hammersmith & Fulham is the only council in the country to offer free home care.

Our home care service is for residents who need extra support to continue living independently at home.

#### **Outstanding Reablement team**

Hammersmith & Fulham also has an Outstanding Reablement team.

The dedicated team, which offers up to six weeks' free care focused on rebuilding independence after medical treatment, has retained its rating from the Care Quality Commission for a third successive year. The team works 365 days a year, 8am to 10pm, supporting more than 500 residents with a personalised support plan.

Fiona Curzon received three weeks of care after breaking her femur in two places.

"They were just perfect, they treated you with the exact care and respect that you treat yourself with. They were utterly charming and absolute poppets," she said.

This team works with H&F's integrated health colleagues to facilitate safe and timely hospital discharges, and our health community teams to prevent unnecessary hospital admissions. This helps cut NHS costs and the wait for hospital beds.

## **Expanding our cycle routes and storage**

We know cycling is hugely popular in H&F. That's why we continue to build new infrastructure for cyclists to make the borough easier to get around

Last year, we opened our first cycle storage hub. The new Cycle Hub in Hammersmith Broadway provides safe and secure shelter for more than 80 bikes – including cargo bikes – as well as a tool station to take care of quick fixes and flat tyres.

This spring, we're planning a new cycle storage hub in Fulham's Coomer Place. The proposed hub will be in a former car park off North End Road and offer space for 20 bikes.

We also know that residents want more cycle storage in their streets. That's why we're installing 600 new bike hangars across the borough over the next three years.

Local cycling is also set to get safer as we work to create two new segregated cycle pathways in H&F. Wood Lane in White City will connect with the revamped Cycleway 34 running south from Hammersmith gyratory to Fulham. While our Safer Cycle Pathway will be extended from Hammersmith Broadway to Olympia.

We want to make it easier for more people to cycle and walk – as we seek to improve air quality and people's health.
