# Tackling damp and mould with tech

### We're rolling out new smart sensors to help keep your homes dry and safe

Hammersmith & Fulham Council is now trialling a new smart sensors system in residents' homes to help prevent damp and mould issues.

The sensors provide the dedicated damp and mould team with live data on room temperatures and humidity levels in the property.

A surveyor will get in touch with you to set up a home visit if the data indicates any potential damp and mould problems, and can also provide guidance or arrange for any necessary fixes, if needed.

This proactive and preventative approach to damp and mould will help keep residents in a warm, safe and decent home.

We're also working closely with our NHS and public health colleagues as part of this pilot to ensure you're receiving all the support you need.

Our number one priority is to keep you safe. We continue to make improvements to our housing service to make H&F the best place to live in a council home in Britain.

### Regulator of Social Housing latest update

The Regulator of Social Housing has begun to publish judgements on how well social housing landlords in England are meeting its new consumer standards.

The standards are designed to drive long-term improvements in the sector. The Regulator is also carrying out planned inspections of all large social landlords over a four-year cycle.

There are 22 new tenant satisfaction measures. Ten measured by landlords and 12 are from tenant surveys. The Regulator will publish all landlords' results in the autumn.

# Driving down damp and mould cases

We're investing £1.4million a week to modernise our homes to make them safe and comfortable

This record investment includes funding for our dedicated damp and mould team and new specialist contractors who have now completed all overdue damp and mould repair jobs in our homes. More than 1,100 jobs overall have been successfully completed since April 2023.

We're offering some residents a hygrometer to measure condensation levels in their homes to help prevent damp and mould issues. Our new smart sensors trial is underway as we monitor live data from residents' homes to again help stop damp and mould problems from arising and help keep residents safe.

The team has also introduced a new call back service. All tenants are contacted after six weeks, to check all mould treatment works carried out have resolved any issues in their home. We've developed a damp and mould booklet together with residents to keep tenants informed on how we can support them.

Local resident **Claudia Domingues** is helping to improve housing for Disabled residents in H&F

Claudia is the chair of the resident-led Disabled People's Housing Strategy and Implementation Group. She's now helping us to improve the way we work with Disabled residents.

Claudia, who lives on the Bayonne Estate, still cannot believe that she is the Chair of this group after taking on the role in May 2022.

"I love it. It's a privilege to have this opportunity and I feel proud every time we have a meeting as we work together to make a difference," said Claudia.

"During the pandemic I started to work from home. I wanted to give back to the community but as an asthmatic I was high risk. I looked on the H&F website for ways of contributing and came across the Disabled people's group."

Building on H&F's Disabled Commission, the group aims to ensure Disabled residents live as independently as possible with opportunities to access the appropriate housing services and suitable accommodation.

"This group was at the time a very new concept not only for H&F but in the country. As a resident of H&F and being involved in co-production is very rewarding," added Claudia who previously lived on the White City Estate.
